Rodriguez has requested to appoint Derek Carle as a volunteer ESDA Deputy Director. Member Toland moved with a second by member Marcott to send to Full Board in January the appointment of Derek Carle as a volunteer ESDA Deputy Director. Motion carried on a voice vote.

During the recent blizzard Rodriguez was very pleased with response from local responders, plow and tow truck drivers. He received excellent information prior to the storm, and has found some areas that can be improved. On December 1<sup>st</sup> McDonough County had two EF-0 tornadoes touch down, fortunately there was not any damage and it did not hurt anyone. Sirens were activated in Macomb under Rodriguez's authority and they were also activated in other local communities which led to the discovery that the siren in Bardolph was not working correctly so a test was conducted on December 11<sup>th</sup>. Rodriguez and Chad Sperry with WIU GIS went to Taylorville to assist the local responders with damage assessment after the tornado that caused major damage in Taylorville.
